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Learners for Life







The Prairie Spirit Board of Education approved the Division's 2019/20 budget at its meeting on June 17. Division-wide staffing levels will be maintained to support Prairie Spirit students.

For 2019/20, the Division will receive almost \$123 million in provincial funding for operational costs. This represents an overall increase of \$1.9 million in funding (1.86%) over the previous year.

The funding increase is based on a projected enrolment increase of approximately 100 students this fall.

"The Board is pleased that this budget maintains Division staffing to support our students," said Sam Dyck, Board Chair.

The budget reflects the Division's rising fixed costs in a variety of areas, including utilities, employment costs and facilities.

Despite the funding increase, reductions were required to balance the budget, including reducing:

- Division-based teacher professional development
- Teacher release time for extra-curricular activities
- Discretionary budget to add staff as needed throughout the school year

In addition to these reductions, other operational efficiencies will be implemented.

Due to the increasing number of students requiring bus transportation, three new bus driver positions and bus routes are part of the 2019/20 budget.

In this budget, the Board has responded to the provincial priorities, as detailed in the Education Sector Strategic Plan (ESSP). The Division will be adding the equivalent of

three full-time, temporary teaching positions to support the provincial goals in the following areas:

- Early Learning;
- Reading/Writing/Math;
- First Nations and Métis Engagement and Graduation Rates; and
- Graduation Rates.

These temporary, part-time Learning Support Facilitator positions will be in place for up to three years to strategically support student outcomes. Restricted reserve funds had been designated for this work and will be used to cover the costs of these positions.

"We are very excited about the impact these teaching positions will have in these key learning areas in our school division," said Lori Jeschke, Director of Education. "Our long-range planning has allowed us to access the funds needed to move ahead with this strategy."

All school divisions must submit a balanced budget to the Ministry of Education by the end of June each year.

This celebration was attended by representatives from Muskeg Lake Cree Nation, Beardy's and Okemasis First Nation, the Prairie Spirit Board of Education, Division Office staff, Stobart Community School, Blaine Lake Composite School and Leask Community School.

The program concluded with a song called *Every Day is Yours*, led by the Junior Sky Boyz, and a spontaneous round dance (above).


