


Clavet Composite School students created this colourful, collaborative art project, drawing inspiration from Kandinsky's concentric circles and The Dot by Peter Reynolds.




The Board received an update regarding a number of renovation projects underway at Division schools. The update was provided at the Board meeting on September 7.

Funding for these projects and for the construction of a new school in Blaine Lake was announced by the provincial government as part of stimulus funding in June 2020.

The Aberdeen project was completed in July. All other projects are ongoing (see list below).

The new school project in Blaine Lake is expected to be ready for tender by the end of 2021, with construction starting in March 2022. The project is expected to be complete by September 2023.





## **Nomination for Premier's Award for Innovation**

The Board approved a nomination for Spirit eLearning School, Prairie Spirit's online K-12 school, to the Premier's Award for Innovation and Excellence.

The Board strongly supported the creation of a comprehensive online school as a response to the COVID -19 pandemic. Spirit eLearning School (SeLS) is innovative in the way the school's virtual classrooms mirror typical Prairie Spirit classrooms in terms of daily schedule, routines and expectations.

Developed in 1999, the Premier's Award recognizes educational innovations and improvements focused on student achievement that have been advanced or directed by boards of education. The \$3,000 prize is to be used to support or extend the innovation or project.

This year's Premier's Award winner will be announced at the Saskatchewan School Boards General Assembly in November.

## **Trustee Highlight**



**Ken Crush** has served as the Board of Education Trustee for Subdivision 3 (Langham and Borden) since 2013.

Ken was a teacher and administrator, completing his teaching career at Langham Elementary School as Principal. He was the Assistant Director of Pupil Services for Saskatoon

West School Division until his retirement in 2001. After his retirement, he facilitated educational seminars for Educational Associates for the U of S Leadership unit for a number of years.

Ken says the development and growth of *My Prairie Spirit Classroom* is a highlight of his time as a Trustee.
